



Offering God's Forgiveness

Matthew 18:21-35

We don't deserve that forgiveness but God offers it anyway.

1. We love forgiveness if we can choose when to forgive and when not.

Jesus put no limit on forgiveness because true forgiveness comes from a heart of love, and love keeps no record of wrongs (1 Cor. 13:5).

Jesus also gives us a warning to not be one of "those people" who hurt other people with our words and actions.

When you offer forgiveness, it benefits you more than the offender.

It simply means that we will no longer be controlled by the offense because we have given it to God to handle as he sees fit.

2. We expect unconditional grace from God while excusing our long-held grudge against someone else.

One of the things we resist most in life is "releasing" the desire for "payback" toward our offenders.

3. The extent of God's mercy depends on the amount of mercy you express to others.

It simply makes no sense for a person who has freely received God's forgiveness, to then deny that forgiveness to another.



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
